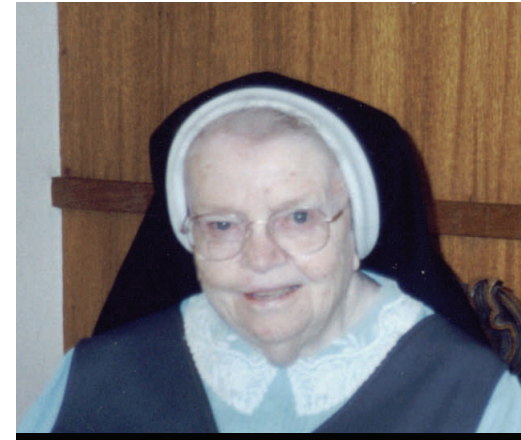

Let all the earth rejoice.

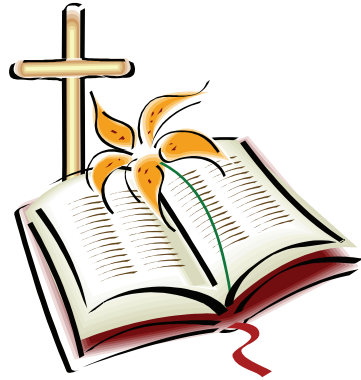
1. I will give thanks to you, my Lord.
